Our Traditions


As a German family living in the Netherlands we have embraced traditions from both countries, which we also want to share with our kids. When we adopt a child from the US we also plan to celebrate American holidays like Thanksgiving. The US expat community in the Netherlands hosts special celebrations for Independence Day which we also look forward to. We also have some traditions that we created as a family.

Our top 6 traditions:

- German Christmas: Christmas is the biggest family tradition of the year for many German families. We visit both sets of grandparents each year. In the weeks before Christmas we decorate the house and bake traditional cookies.
- King's Day: a traditional Dutch holiday in April celebrating the King's birthday with parades, music and flea markets
- Sunday family breakfast with either pancakes or waffles: we do that every Sunday before going on a fun day trip with the family
- Summer road trip/camping: each summer we go on a different road trip, usually camping along the way.
- Family time: each year we go away for a long weekend with Debora's and/or Monika's family
- Bedtime traditions: we have a dedicated bedtime ritual with Samuel. We read stories and sing traditional German Iuliabies

Monika works from home, and for Samuel, it is a short day at daycare. Monika picks Samuel up from daycare a bit earlier and they do something fun together before dinner time.


Friday


