Dear birthmother,

In the spring of 1994 we met in High School. During the first six years of our relationship Anne-Lies lived with her parents. Rosanne rented a room and spent all weekends and holidays with Anne-Lies and her parents. Anne-Lies' parents immediately considered Rosanne as their daughter in law. They are extremely supportive of our decision to adopt and look forward to becoming grandparents. After we successfully graduated from college, we moved into an apartment together. When we had been living together for a while, we thought about being mothers. We shortly considered a pregnancy, but almost immediately the thought of adoption came to mind. We decided we wanted to give a home to a child which by circumstance does not have a home. Raising an adopted child together seemed a wonderful idea to us. In the winter of 2002 we bought a nice house in a village and we have been very busy with painting and making the house warm and cozy. It is a safe and loving home, but missing a child to enjoy it.

We have a beautiful home with our own private garden. The garden is very safe for children to play in. Visitors have to enter a gate to have access to the garden. We live in a quiet street, where there is not much traffic. On our street live many families with little children. Right next door lives a single mom with three daughters. There are a number of green fields in our neighbourhood, where children gather to play soccer. These fields are in the middle of blocks of houses, which makes it very safe. In the village are a lot of schools, sports clubs and social clubs.

Our house has a large living room, a kitchen, a second kitchen with room for the laundry machine, 5 bedrooms and bathrooms. Outside we have a separate garage. We decorated one bedroom especially for a baby.


